## FROM THE DESK OF ED PRIEHS, DPW SUPERINTENDENT

Pavement improvements will be completed this construction season at the following locations:

Seventh Street	(N. Almont Ave. to Handley Street)
Handley Street	(Seventh Street to W. Fourth Street)
Sixth Street	(Handley Street to Dead End)
P. O. & N. Street	(W. Fourth Street to W. Fifth Street)

Also, road improvements will be completed on N. Blacks Corners Road from W. Fourth Street to the North City Limits. Improvements include milling and resurfacing pavement from W. Fourth Street to Attica Road. Additionally, crushing and shaping existing pavement from Attica Road to the City Limits, and repaving with hot mix asphalt. This project is partially funded from an MDOT Category B Grant that Imlay City received.

## From the Officers and Staff of the Imlay City Fire Department

Summer is here, and we encourage our residents to enjoy it. Make sure you dress appropriately; light-colored cotton fabric is a good choice if you want to stay cool. If you need sun protection, use clothing made of fabrics that block harmful UV rays. This clothing is usually made of synthetic material, dark in color, and has an ultraviolet protection factor (UPF) rating. A UPF rating of 15 is good; the Skin Cancer Foundation recommends a UPF rating of 30. This clothing performs best when it is kept dry. Sunglasses are needed to prevent UV rays from damaging your eyes. They should block 99-100% of UVA and UVB rays. Hats are also a practical way to protect your head and face. The brims on hats should be at least 3 inches wide for adults and 2.5 inches wide for babies and toddlers.

Sunscreen is a must; look for one with a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 30. When at the beach, use sunscreen with a higher SPF number and opt for one that is also waterproof. Lip balm is also a good choice for lip protection. Another key item is to stay hydrated and sip water throughout the day to prevent dehydration. The goal is to keep your urine output clear. Water and sugar-free juices are good choices to keep you hydrated and nourished in hot weather. Avoid alcoholic beverages; they only help to dehydrate you. If you choose to enjoy an alcoholic beverage, drink responsibly with a bottle of water between each beverage.

Please enjoy the summer season, and most of all, do the right things to stay safe.
