## FROM THE DESK OF ED PRIEHS, DPW SUPERINTENDENT

The DPW will continue brush pick-up on the first and third Monday of each month, until the end of November. Curbside leaf pickup is scheduled to begin Monday, October 21, 2024. NORTH of the railroad tracks will be picked-up on Monday, and SOUTH of the railroad tracks will be picked-up on Tuesday. November 26, will be the last day of curbside leaf pickup. Please do not place leaves onto the street until a few days before the start date. This will keep streets clear and safe, and allow the DPW to sweep streets until leaf pick-up begins. As a reminder, leaves CAN be bagged for pickup by the City's waste hauler, from April to the end of November. The only time leaves are permitted to be placed onto the street is from the middle of October, through the end of November.

Now that fall is upon us, here are some important items to consider as you embrace and enjoy this time of year.

With the days getting shorter, mornings tend to be foggy, and visibility when driving becomes more challenging. School is in session, so be watchful for children out playing, and obey the school zone speed limit. Additionally, fall is a time when wildlife is more active and on the move. Slow down when driving, especially on curvy or narrow roads where visibility around corners is difficult, and pay attention to postings for animal crossings.

Before winter arrives, it's a good idea to call a professional to do your annual furnace servicing. Your furnace is by far the most essential appliance in your home. Have the filters cleaned or replaced. Get your chimney inspected every fall. Use fireplace screens to protect from flying sparks and embers. When we "fall back," it's the perfect time to replace the batteries in smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors. Having a working fire extinguisher in the house is also a good idea, and everyone who lives there should be familiar with how it works.
